We're looking forward to our new school term in September. Here is some information for you about our new school year.

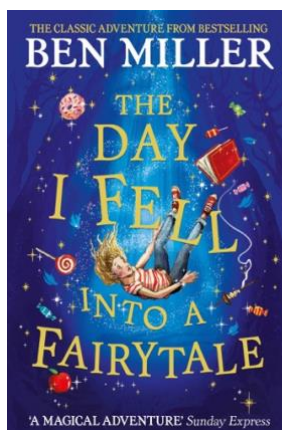
Mrs Riddell will be teaching in Foxes on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons and Mrs Cast will be teaching on Thursday and Friday. On Wednesday mornings we will be alternating.

Learning in Foxes

Each day will start promptly at 8.40 (please note registration will close at 8.50am and doors will open at 8.40am for those not at breakfast club). English and Maths will be taught each morning and, in the afternoon, we will be focusing on our topic work, which will incorporate all subject areas as outlined in the National Curriculum. An overview of the topics will be on our class page of the school website in September.

Our first topic will be "Walk like an Egyptian?". We'll be finding out all about the Ancient Egyptians in history, looking at the amazing archaeology they left behind in art and reading an Egyptian version of Cinderella in English. In Science we'll be investigating forces and magnets.

To begin with, we are going to read "The Day I fell into a Fairytale" by Ben Miller as a class. If possible, we'd like every child to have their own copy of the book. It is available from bookshops, Amazon and other online book websites as well as some supermarkets. If there are any problems, let us know and I'm sure we can help. We do have some copies in school. It's best if your child does not need read this over the summer, we'd like to enjoy it as a class in September!



It's essential that your child keeps reading over the summer holidays. Please encourage them to read anything and everything! Blackburn Library is taking part in the Summer Reading Challenge (<https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/>) and Lancashire libraries have their own reading trail for the children to take part in based around the local area. We can't wait to find out your favourite summer read when you return to school in September!

What to bring into school in September

In September, your child can bring in their own pencil case if they wish (the smaller see through ones are the best) with pencils, coloured pencils, a rubber, pencil sharpener, ruler, scissors and a Pritt stick type glue. All these should be practical and not gimmicky toys to avoid distractions. The pencil case needs to fit in their drawer. They need to bring their things to school in a red school book bag which will come home each evening with their reading books inside.

Our class will be doing P.E. on Monday and Thursday. Your child will need to have their trainers in school every day so they can join in with sports clubs. If they have a new PE kit, they can wear it to school on Monday and Thursday otherwise their PE kit should be in school every day. This must be in a drawstring bag to fit in our cloakroom, no rucksacks or other bags please.

Please ensure all their clothes are named, especially jumpers and cardigans. They need to bring a named plastic water bottle into school every day that they can open and refill. School bottles are the best and are available from the school office. Please do not send in water bottles that have open straws as this causes spillages.

In Foxes, we love being outside no matter what the weather so please send your child into school with a waterproof coat every day and suitable footwear. We'd like every child to have a pair of wellies in school. If you don't have any wellies, we'll be opening our welly sale in the first few weeks of September as we have a lot of spare wellies already in school!

It is important that the children are as independent as possible. To prepare for September, please support us at home in any way you can, such as giving your child the responsibility of getting his or her own things ready and carrying their own things when they're out and about.
