There is no better start to the week than having a walk in the fresh air and marvelling at the beauty of creation. We found Welsh poppies, lots of wild garlic, speedwell, wild strawberries, herb Robert and Little Robin, ivy, holly and lots of varieties of trees.




















Then our junior children ended the week with a visit to the UCLAN Science festival. It was wonderful to see the children engaged in so many different branches of the Sciences and to hear their aspirations for the future, with many children talking about their future careers as surgeons, nurses, forensic scientists, opticians and nano-technology scientists. We found out all about the wonders of 'ugly' creatures and how they adapt and camouflage to their surroundings, whilst Year 3/4 made their own clay pots as part of their learning about pre-history and archaeological sciences. Year 5 & 6 spent an hour learning about the life experiences of a deaf scientist and how she uses British Sign Language to communicate. She explained her sensory experience of the world around her and the children asked some thought provoking and sensitive questions to find out more about her perceptions of the world. A huge thank you to Mrs Riddell for organising this amazing opportunity to widen our children's opportunities and outlook.

Our FOBS group met on Thursday evening this week to help organise our Summer Fun Event on **Saturday 8th July from 5-8pm**. Every week, our newsletter will feature a segment on how to keep ourselves safe in body, mind and spirit. I talked to many of our year 6 today about how they know our school is a **safe place** and they all started to talk about how we have locked doors, first-aiders, padlocks on gates and finger guards on doors, but I then asked them to think about safety as more than *health and safety* and how we ensure that our school is a safe and happy place to be. They then said (to my delight) that they know in our school that they always have someone to talk to and that bullying is not allowed to happen in our school because we are able to talk about things as soon as they happen and the teachers sort them out.

I wanted to make sure *you* were all aware that we have 3 trained Designated Safeguarding Leaders in our schools - **Mrs Gow, Mrs Draycott and Mrs Johnstone** and we are available to everyone to discuss ANY concerns you may have about a child/your family's safety, wellbeing or needs. As a Christian school, safeguarding and looking after each of you, as precious and valuable children of God, is at the forefront of all we do and is rooted in the culture and daily life of our school. Ms Emma James and Mr Jonathan Greenwood are our safeguarding governors.

#### Transition cluster event




