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Mrs Gow's Words for the Week...





The children have wowed us this week with their deep thinking, insight and team work. I would like to thank the members of staff who took unpaid industrial action this week to highlight the plight of school funding, and also the staff members who have worked so flexibly in school to make the strike days such meaningful themed days for the school family. On Wednesday, the junior children worked

on the Spirited Arts Project - an international competition that gets children thinking about some 'big' questions about theology and life. We chose to explore a theme that is very close to our school family's heart, based on the famous inaugural speech made by the late Jo Cox in the House of Commons where she said, "We have more in common than that which divides us!" The children's creative responses to this theme made us quite emotional as the children showed such empathy, inclusivity and equity. We explored the importance of the Rule of Law in our country and how protected characteristics mean that we ALL have a right to be treated with parity and fairness. A huge thank you to the many parents/carers who sent in religious quotes about unity. We loved exploring the many similarities in the golden thread that weaves between the faiths in our school - loving one another and treating others as we would like to be treated.

I wanted to share some of the children's work with you, so you can see the range of creativity (from art, poetry, sculpture and even a rap!)




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House points for this week

Holiday club consultation



As a school we completely understand just how hard it can be to find child-care during the school holidays if you are working. Therefore, we have been in consultation with SportsCool about setting up a holiday club provision at our school potentially starting at May half-term. This would be dependent on getting enough interest in the club to make it financially viable for them to run the scheme at our school as a new venue. The days would run from 8.30am -4pm and would be charged at between £15-£20 per day, with a full week - Monday-Friday getting one day free. The children



Wonderful Oracy and storytelling in EYFS



Over the coming year in school we are having a huge push on improving our children's vocabularies, story-telling, nursery rhyme and speaking and listening skills. All learning floats on a sea of high quality talk. If you child can speak it, then they won't be able to write it. As a school we have banned the sentence opener "So basically...." Here are two of our youngest learners in EYFS retelling Goldilocks using high quality vocabulary. Please do jot down any new words/vocab that your child has learnt in their reading books in your child's reading record, as we are finding that many of the children (especially in the juniors) are more than capable of decoding and reading a word correctly but do not know what it means and this is having a detrimental impact on their comprehension.

Please do spend time talking through a couple of words from your child's reading every night and jot these words down in their reading records.

IPad scheme & internet safety



This year we have moved to 1:1 devices in the juniors and we are working towards becoming an Apple Distinguished school. The children and staff have made a fabulous start to using the devices to enhance learning. We have had some real success with Showbie, Padlet and Keynote as 3 new learning tools. Every week we are hoping to add an internet safety section to the newsletter to keep us up-to-date with the ever changing world of tech!

The parents from Fox class who have adopted our Parent pay scheme will be able to take their child's device between home and school from Friday of next week. Please send into school a signed copy of the Parental Acceptable Usage policy (being sent home on Monday) before Friday so your child can bring their device home. Parents, please come and see Mrs Gow with your mobile phone and the Jamf parent app installed so she can show you how to safely manage the device. Jonathan Greenwood our school Internet Safety governor has also provided some advice on making sure your home filtering systems are adequate. Thank you so much Jonathan!

Home and Mobile Network Filtering

When it comes to online safety, are you making the most of your home broadband and mobile phone contracts? Did you know that most of the main suppliers include **free** tools to help make the internet

a safer place for you and all of the family. These tools generally include a filtering system which can block access to inappropriate websites for any device connected to your wifi or mobile network in a similar manner to the filtering system used in school. These filters can usually be customised to suit various age ranges and can be set up to apply different filtering levels at different times of the day. Some of these systems can also help to prevent you accessing viruses, phishing or malware-infected sites.

Unfortunately, in most case theses services aren't switched on by default, so you'll need to log into your broadband or mobile account and activate them yourself. It should only take a couple of minutes and thankfully 'InternetMatters.org' have already done all the hard work and created guides to run you through the setup for all the various suppliers. Please note that even though network filtering is a very useful tool for helping to increase online safety for your family, it does have some limitations to its effectiveness so please don't rely on it as your only means of protection. We also need to consider applying parental controls to devices, apps and online platforms which we can consider in more detail next time.
