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Mrs Gow's Words for the Week...



In worship this week we have been considering what justice and fairness mean in our modern world. Justice is a very 'big' topic to consider but through our work on Fairtrade and equity the children are getting a really deep understanding of how they can make a difference to the world through their small actions. We are now in Fairtrade Fortnight (Feb 27th - March 12th) and on Tuesday of this week we spent a full day exploring the concept of Fairtrade, where some of our favourite foods come from and how, through choosing Fairtrade wherever possible, we can help some of the world's farmers gain a fairer price for their labours. Importantly, for our school too, we explored how important it is to buy locally and support the farming industry in our community. We considered the fact that just a generation ago (my dad for example - don't tell him I'm calling him old!) it was unusual to get tropical fruits such as pineapples and bananas, as they would only have access to local, seasonal products.

Susan Murphy from the Lancashire Fairtrade society joined us for the day on Tuesday as we completed our activities and she has sent the children the most wonderful reply.














House points for this week

We loved going for our STARS half term treat at Huntleys on Friday.



Balderstone Farmers' Market and Fairtrade stall





Uniform reminders

If you have any serviceable school shoes, trainers or school coats, we would be very grateful for them.

Therapy dog consultation



May I introduce you to Moo (sorry about the name but my children have named her and they think it's hilarious - Moo Gow instead of Moo Cow!). Moo is going to be trained to be a therapy/reading dog for our school. She is a miniature English bulldog, a breed renowned for their placid nature and love of children. She will NEVER be loose around school and will only be in school twice a week, working with children whose parents/carers have given permission for them to meet the dog.

Moo is nearly 7 months old and will only be visiting the school to get used to the environment/noises/smells and sounds for the next few months whilst she completes her training at Mellor Dog School. She will ALWAYS be on her lead whilst in school and will spend her day in Mrs Gow's office/front office in a safely gated enclosure whilst in the room. Children (with permission) will be initially invited to come into the office and read to her whilst she is in the enclosure. She will be walked when the children are NOT out at play until she has completed her basic obedience training. The benefits on wellbeing, mental health and on reading ages are well documented and Moo will be available as part of our nurture offer for children who need a bit of 'down' time walking and talking or reading and stroking. Many of our local secondary schools have already adopted the school dog scheme and we hope to join them in this venture which can have a superb impact on children's reading confidence and reading ages.

She will be trained to be a minimal 'licker' as it is the saliva which we know is an issue for our Muslim families. No child/parent will need to have contact with her if they are either scared or if they would prefer not to be in contact with her. We are hoping that Moo will become a long-standing part of the Balderstone family, who the children get to know and love (she currently has a school jumper and school coat in the making!)

Please do come and talk to Mrs Gow about the scheme if you have any comments or would like a chat OR to meet the dog yourself.

4. Dog behaviour standards

Dogs involved in active sessions in schools must:

- - Not bark, mouth, jump up at, or paw people
- Be adaptable to new environments and unexpected stimuli, such as new smells, objects, and sudden noises

 Be socially confident, enjoy human interaction, and be relaxed and calm in the company of children, even when there is a level of noise and erratic behaviour around
- Be comfortable with appropriate physical interaction e.g. grooming, and not
- respond unduly negatively to unexpected lively behaviour from children
 Be comfortable engaging with children that may have physical/learning
 disabilities, and around mechanical aids e.g. wheelchairs, where relevant
- Exhibit no guarding of resources e.g. food/toys or avoidance behaviour
- Take treats gently when offered and not snatch toys from hands Be easily identifiable as a dog performing a clear role in the school
