Thank you for your care and concern after my fall last week. I had an argument with the icy stone steps at the front of my house and I can conclude that the steps won!

The message I had planned for last Friday's celebration worship was all about counting our blessings and this has truly been at the forefront of my mind this week. Every single day, it is a privilege to bear witness to the skill of our staff, the kindness and wonderful values that our children hold and the support of our governors and families.

Today I had the pleasure of taking 4 of our junior children to County Hall in Preston to attend the Lancashire Fairtrade Conference. We had a marvellous day learning all about how we can make a difference to the climate crisis, to commerce and trade and how we can be wise consumers. We also got to bring and try lots of Fairtrade foods (mostly chocolate!). As we left the venue this afternoon and walked to the station car park, we passed a number of people begging on the pavements. The children immediately noticed these people and how others were walking past with out even glancing at them. We were carrying our bag of goodies - Fairtrade chocolates, bananas, apple juice. Then the children stopped in the middle of the street and said, "Do you think we could give these to the man sat on the street over there, our food from today?"

My heart sang, as these children all had hearts of compassion. They could easily have kept the goodies for themselves, but they were more concerned about sharing with those less fortunate. I approached the young man and asked him if he would like any of the food we had with us. He told the children that they had made his day and that Maltesers were his favourite food and he hadn't had them for ages. Those children touched that man's spirit this afternoon and I counted my

blessings as Headteacher of these incredible young people. These children truly acted as Jesus' hands and feet in Preston today.

Coram education - Life Bus Visit






