This has been a very busy week in school as we get ready for the Nativity play next Wednesday. We have had a number of exciting visitors/events in school this week - Max the musician visited school to get ready to launch our new school Rock Band, Lancashire Fire Department came in to remind Year 2 and Year 6 all about fire safety and then we rounded off our week with this afternoon's fabulous Coffee Creative. I've been privileged to see a sneak peak of this year's nativity play, 'Prickly Hay', and I can assure you that we are in for a treat next week.

In worship, Reverend Karen joined us, to help us understand the season of Advent and why it is so important to Christians. Both Year 1 and 2 took part in Forest School this week. We were den building on the field. Which team would stay dry inside their shelter when the rain shower came along?








