## Mrs Gow's Words for the Week...



This week in worship we have been thinking about loyalty. The story of Ruth has made us consider **who** and **what** we are loyal to and how we show others that we care for them. "Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay." Ruth 1:16

This week has felt very autumnal in school and there have been some seasonal activities going on across school. EYFS have made some wonderful autumn leaf skewers this week and really enjoyed their autumn walk. Year One have been out hunting conkers in Forest School.













On Wednesday, every class had the opportunity to work with Neil from the Ribble River Trust to explore different types of river/stream water for signs of life. The brook that runs through our Forest School area was teeming with river shrimps, but we noticed that the current food chains were quite limited. The children compared this with a sample from a stream in Burnley to compare the different species. It helped us all realise how important it is to look after our local environment.



## Meet the Governor




This week it is the turn of Yasmin Riaz, one of our Parent Governors to introduce herself to you.
