Dear school family,

Despite this being a **slightly** shorter week in school, it has been filled with lots of amazing learning across school. Reception Rabbits have been doing some wonderful phonics and I have heard some WOW segmenting and blending this week with Raiyan proudly showing me his reading 'all by himself!' A huge thank you for all your support with reading at home. Reading just 10 minutes a night, every night, is proven to have a MASSIVE impact on your child's vocabulary and educational achievement - as your child is exposed to approximately 1 million more words a year! Thank you to you all for your outstanding support in our Meet the Teacher meetings this week. It was a delight to see so many of you in school.

This week Year 1 and 2 have been enjoying writing their own innovated versions of the Little Red Hen story setting them in the jungle! The juniors had their first visit from the Let's Go Sing team and have started to learn the new songs for their concert in King George's Hall in March 2023. It's always a joy to hear the hall filled with singing! Mrs Burton is getting ready to hold the democratic elections for the new school council and we have had lots of interest from the children in taking up this important responsibility role in school. Next week, Ms Emma James shall be sending out details of ways in which you, as parents, grandparents and friends of our school can also get involved in the leadership of our school, with information about our forthcoming parent governor elections. FOBS are also meeting next week!

I have included a Save the Date page at the back of this week's newsletter for you to share with any clubs/community/faith groups that your child may attend. We are giving out the dates now, at the start of the year, to some of our key school events, so that these dates can be protected for our whole school community and so we can also outreach to a wider area of our local community. Events such as our school productions, the Let's Go Sing concert, school adventure holidays etc are an essential (and fun) part of our curriculum offer and we would like you to share these dates with your children's other community groups, so they know when your child and family will be invited to support school by attending events outside of school hours. This also means that these groups can be invited to share in your child's triumphs too.

It would be lovely if school could also be informed of key dates for your child too - such as any presentation evenings, award evenings, galas, competitions, exam weeks etc - so we can also support and share in these events with your child.

Our local PCSO policing team would like to thank you for your care and consideration on the road over the past week. They will be regularly patrolling the areas surrounding our local schools to help promote road safety and seatbelt awareness.

As part of our new house points system, the children are donating some of their awarded house team points every week to a class fund (so the children can share a whole class treat at the end of the half-term) and also giving a proportion of their house points to chosen charities. It has been a real blessing to see the children being such courageous advocates and sharing their house points so generously to help others less fortunate than themselves. Our thoughts and prayers are with those children sitting the Grammar School entry exam this weekend.


Allergies in school (snacks and packed lunches)


FOBS Meeting




