Uniform, jewellery and PE



School Admissions for 2023

Primary Admissions - If your child is in their last year of pre-school or nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools. It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. You must apply even if you already have siblings in school or if your child currently attends the pre -school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. Please note, if you are a non-Lancashire resident, e.g. Blackburn with Darwen, you will need to apply through your own local authority. The closing date for primary applications for September 2023 is

15th January 2023 If you are applying to Balderstone please ensure you complete a Supplementary Information Form which you can get from the school office.

Secondary Admissions - If your child is in year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools. It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of you application. You must apply even if you already have siblings in the secondary school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. Please note if you are a non-Lancashire resident, e.g. Blackburn with Darwen, you will need to apply through your own local authority The closing date for secondary applications for September 2023 is 31st October 2022 Please do not hesitate to contact school directly if you need any advice about admissions. We understand that applying to high school is a stressful time for parents. Mrs Heyworth will talk about the process more in her Meet the Teacher session.


