Primary Admissions - If your child is in their last year of pre-school or nursery you can now apply for their primary school place at <a href="http://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-deucation-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/">http://www.lancashire.gov.uk/children-deucation-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place/</a> It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application. You must apply even if you already have siblings in school or if your child currently attends our Balderstone pre -school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. Please note, if you are a non-Lancashire resident, e.g. Blackburn with Darwen, you will need to apply through your own local authority. eg Blackburn. The closing date for primary applications for September 2024 is 15th January 2024 If you are

applying to Balderstone please ensure you complete a Supplementary Information Form which you can get from the school office.

Secondary Admissions - If your child is in year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place <a href="www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools">www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools</a>. It is quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of you application. You must apply even if you already have siblings in the secondary school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application. Please note if you are a non-Lancashire resident, e.g. Blackburn with Darwen, you will need to apply through your own local authority The closing date for secondary applications for September 2024 is 31st October 2023. Please do not hesitate to contact school directly if you need any advice about admissions. We understand that applying to high school is a stressful time for parents. Secondary schools are starting to advertise their Open Evenings. We would advise that our Year 5 and Year 6 parents and children attend the open evenings, to give you plenty of decision making time. Pre-School Admissions - We are taking applications for Pre-school places for January 2024. If your child is aged 3 before 31st December 2023 you will qualify for the free universal 15 hours childcare provision and you may be eligible for an additional 15 hours extended care. Pre—school children are fully integrated into the whole school. They work within the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Unit alongside Reception children, with a highly qualified staff team, where they can play and learn together in the 'Rabbits' class. If you would like more information please take a look at our website or give the office a call. Closing date is 2nd October 2023.

The range and complexity of today's technology can often seem bewildering for many adults, particularly with older children who may seem to be permanently 'connected'. Parents and Carers are key partners in helping to safeguard our children when using technologies such as Laptops, Tablets, Smartphones and Games Consoles - as such, it is useful to agree some ground rules to support their safe use. 

- Agree some ground rules set out your expectations (and why). e.g. when can they go online and for how long (don't forget, most gaming consoles now use the Internet as well) ?
- ☐ Talk to your child about the online world what do they like, what worries them and what to do if something goes wrong
- ☐ Get your child to talk to you Not confident? Don't know your Tweets from your Snaps? Consider a 'role swap' and let your child become your teacher to increase your own knowledge
- ☐ Consider parental controls solutions don't need to be technical but filters on the home internet connection can help to screen inappropriate content
- ☐ Don't jump to conclusions if something goes wrong we all make mistakes. Some sites/apps may include 'clickbait' in order to generate advertising income.
- ☐ Ensure privacy settings are set up on apps/sites and gaming consoles - there are often more options than typically thought but remember we still need to be careful what we share
- ☐ Keep an open dialogue problems often go unreported for fear of losing access to the technologies they treasure
