Mrs Gow's words for the week....



This week has been a powerful reminder of the importance of prayer. Thank you for asking about Mrs Draycott after her car crash this week. Thankfully, she is in one piece, if a little battered and stiff. In school we have been focusing on peace this half-term - peace in our school, peace in our homes, peace in our hearts and praying for peace in our world. This week has been anti-bullying week, where we have been teaching the children to make a noise about bullying. This made us think about the things we stand up for, and to.

Today, we have supported our annual Children in Need charity event through sharing an hour of games, stalls and eating lots of treats! It reminds us of the importance of fun, fellowship and friendship and also how blessed we are. School Council, led by our very own charity champion Mrs Burton, did an outstanding job of transforming the hall into a games hall.

Year 5 (and a few of History council) had a superb trip to Lancashire Museum earlier in the week, where we learnt all about World War 2, the sinking of the Bismarck, the importance of Bletchley Park and also how to decipher morse code. We explored mapping skills, interpreting sources such as aerial photographs and even the technique for parachuting from a plane. Lots of the children commented afterwards that it must have been terrifying to have lived through the wars and this made me think even more about those facing the horrors of war now. A huge thank you to Mrs Turner for organising the trip and to our wonderful taxis - Mrs Leaver, Mrs Johnstone and Juwairiyah's daddy who stepped in at the last minute.

We have some wonderful news to share with you.... our recent visit from His Majesties Inspectors went incredibly well and the formal report was released last week. The Ofsted inspectors really did pick up on the ethos and feel of our school that makes it a special place to work and learn. They have asked us to work on retention of knowledge (something we are already doing this year anyway) so there were no surprises for us there. A huge congratulations to everyone in our school family, the children, staff, governors and parents for all we do together to make our school great. We shall continue our mission for excellence in a context of love and community. The Diocese was thrilled with our report and the Director of Education sent us a much appreciated letter, which I have included below.

So prayers this week for safety, prayers for peace, prayers for those who are facing the horrors of war, prayers for those charities in the UK that make such a difference in our communities and prayers of thanks for our school and a prayer of gratitude from me to God for blessing me with our school.

Opportunity Sports Federation got £29,760


Bahja Initiative £45,000


Coffee Creative - Winter Wreath making

Safeguarding Section



This week has been anti-bullying week in school, where we have been thinking about the difference between banter and bullying. This week I wanted to share with you the advice from the NBH - the National Bullying Helpline about how to keep your child safe from online bullying. So much chat, messaging and conversation now goes on between young people using their phones, headsets, tablets and messaging services - so it is essential that we as grown ups are reinforcing the same message of importance of speaking out and staying safe digitally too. Here is their guide to online bullying.

Keeping your child safe from bullying online

Parents, you have a role to play. Remember, the police can often trace the perpetrators. You need to check that your child is safe and that they take care. Check their sites and monitor their browsing and mail content periodically. Sit down and talk to your child about his or her concerns.

Criminal Charges may be brought under The Harassment Act and other legislation that is there to protect you and your child. Talk to your family and those who you trust. A problem shared is a problem halved! If you ever come across anything on the internet that makes you feel uncomfortable, no matter where it is, pleas e report it. Be Cyber-Savvy in all your on-line activities. Teach your children how to be Cyber-Savvy. Being Cyber-Savvy is the new "Don't talk to strangers"

Read this out to your child

Don't give your name, age, address or contact details to strangers over the internet even if they sound really friendly and you have spoken to them lots of times. If you have never met them, don't fall for their charm. A good person would never ask you to tell them personal information about

yourself. If some over the internet or phone asks you for information, close the computer down or hang up the phone. Come and talk to me about it.

Don't tell people where you live or which school you go to. NEVER arrange to meet them. If a stranger asks you to meet them, see this as a warning sign and tell me or tell a grown up, a responsible person, about this. Confide in someone you trust. If you call a helpline, the volunteer might ask you some basic questions but that is OK provided you telephoned the helpline and they did not phone you.

Do not give any confidential information to someone who calls you. If you are worried or scared, hang up and come and talk to us. Tell your friends or tell us if you are worried about anything. We can help you. Also, change your log-in details regularly and change your passwords. When did you last change the password on your child's mobile phone or computer. Who did you tell? The only two people you should share your password details with are your mum or dad.


