We have some wonderful news to share with you.... we are GOLD! This afternoon we have had confirmation that we have received the highest achievable standard of certification from the Historical Association - the Gold Quality mark. This reflects the stunning work of our History subject champion Mrs Turner, our committed teaching staff, our incredible History Heroes pupil body and our History subject governor Mrs Smith. The assessment process, which has taken a year was incredibly robust including:

Evidence for the assessment was obtained through a scrutiny of the portfolio, a tour of the school with the History Council (called History Heroes), lesson observations in three classes, discussions with four teachers, discussions with the Link Governor for History, Headteacher and Subject Leader, discussions with pupils and the History Council and examining planning, Subject Leaders file, and children's books.

The detailed report highlights the quality of teaching, of pupil knowledge and of history enrichment opportunities in school.

"Particular strengths in this school are the History Heroes council, Subject Leadership and the use of IT to support and record learning."

I would like to thank Mrs Turner for her inspiring leadership of History across school for the benefit of all our pupils and to our incredible history council for being the most enthusiastic learners in all of history!

things we do to stay healthy in body, mind and spirit and how through helping other we can lift our own mood.

We tweeted the author to let him know and he replied! All six books will be in the library very soon, which one will be your favourite?










Dear Parent or Carer

As you may have seen in the news recently, the number of measles cases is increasing across the country. Measles is a serious illness, with one in five children who get the disease having to be admitted to hospital for treatment, so if you or your child have not had your MMR jab, it is vital you come forward.

A new national NHS measles catch up campaign is being launched to contact all parents of children aged from six to 11 years contacted encouraging them to make an appointment with their child's GP practice for their missed MMR vaccine.

months by your GP. If you are unsure if your child has had both vaccinations, please call your GP to confirm or to book an appointment. Older children and adults who have not had two doses of MMR can also ask their GP surgery for a vaccination appointment.

The initial symptoms of measles:

- Resemble a cold with runny nose, cough and a slight fever
- · Eyes become red and sensitive to light

As the illness progresses, children may develop:

- A high fever
- A raised red rash that usually begins on the face and spreads downwards to the neck, trunk, arms, legs and feet
- Small white spots inside the cheeks and lips

For some people, measles can be very serious if it spreads to other parts of the body, such as the lungs and the brain. Problems can include pneumonia, meningitis and seizures (fits).

If you think your child may have measles:

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- Call your GP or NHS111 do not attend your GP practice or any other healthcare setting (e.g. A&E) unless told to do so as measles spreads very easily.
- Avoid close contact with babies, pregnant women and anyone with a weakened immune system. These people are at increased risk of severe disease from measles.
- Stay off nursery, school or college for at least 4 days from when the rash appears.
