



After only a few minutes with our fabulous History Council, I knew that we were going to be absolutely fine - as the children were the most outstanding ambassadors for our school and shone their love of history. They could talk with confidence about all they had learnt in history, about their many trips and visit and about our school innovative, interactive timeline. I was a very proud headteacher watching three history lessons across school with the assessor and seeing our creative and experienced staff in action. The pupils in every class were outstanding. We now await our written report and official confirmation of our grading of Bronze, Silver or Gold! A thank you to the parents who also wrote comments to support our application.

I also received a rather splendid letter from Damien Hinds (Minister for Schools) about our continuing successes in phonics and early reading. I wanted to share it with you and to say a huge well done to our reading and phonics team!

I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Balderstone St Leonard's Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country,

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.


Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

#### We are avid readers!






Year 2 & 3 parent/carer iPad meeting
