Please do speak to me if you would be interested in supporting our governing body.



#### Every day counts - Attendance updates



One of the key indicators to your child's future success in school is excellent attendance. Every week we monitor our classes attendance very carefully to check if our families need any support. Many of our children have outstanding attendance, so well done and thank you. I know that there are a lot of illnesses, bugs and nasty viruses around at the moment and we certainly don't want you to feel that you should send your child in if they are definitely poorly - never in school with vomiting (for past 48 hours), diarrhoea, fevers etc. However, I would ask that you ensure your child is in school if they are 'mildly iffy' eg, tired, bit under the weather and will we always ring you if they don't improve throughout the day.

After speaking to governors this week, we are *currently* not a fining school for unauthorised absence, but current government and Lancashire advice is that we should be fining **each parent** after 5 days of unauthorised absence. **Please** do your very best to book your holiday, pilgrimage or family event with the least impact on your child/children's attendance at school. I know that there are many events, emergencies and cost implications to this, but together let's prioritise every day in school.



EYFS and KS1 Stay and Play - We're Going on a Bear Hunt themed



#### Safeguarding section





#### Humraaz Support Services - Don't struggle alone!



Founded in 2002 and registered as a charity in 2005, Blackburn based Humraaz is led by and for black and minority ethnic women, sustainably supporting and nurturing women from diverse ethnic backgrounds to have a voice. Women who have fled domestic abuse, honour-based violence have been supported to move from crisis to safety in our refuge. Our structured programmes provide the women a safe place to grow, allow integration into society with social and economic stability.

We work in partnership with local and national statutory organisations and have vast experience with the voluntary sector.

We are a culturally sensitive service and understand the intersecting and diverse needs. Part of this work includes addressing personal issues, concerns around family life, the community and also the environment in which the women live in.

We aim to empower service users by teaching life skills which enable them to become independent, take control of their lives and determine their own future. They are encouraged to participate in challenging and stimulating activities within a safe environment, the ultimate goal being to build self-esteem and confidence. This develops the ability to access services and make the most of opportunities to provide their own security and financial independence.

Our Community Services has gradually developed over the last 3 years. We believe that women are crucial in the community to teach their children and to bring about social change. We do this by educating and supporting the women of the borough through companionship, crafting, sharing of experiences, laughter and food.

Our ProDIGY (Professional Development In the Great You) group offers peer support for professional women from ethnic minorities. Through the group we share skills, network, offer support and have a monthly session on topics selected by the group. The sessions are run by the members. We welcome all professional women from ethnic minorities.
