Next week we are hosting our Bear Hunt Interactive Story stay and play on Tuesday and then on Wednesday our winning house team is off to the cinema!



World Book Day - Sustainable reading!




Chocolate Bouquet Raffle - in aid of Marie Curie

Ramadan prayer



To all of our families entering the holy month of Ramadan this weekend, we, as your school family wish that this is a blessed time where you get to grow in spirit and move closer to God. We

understand that fasting is a critical pillar of your faith and we shall do all we can to support you in this. Some of our children in **Owl class** have expressed a wish to fast and we shall accommodate this wherever possible. We would ask that:

OWL CLASS children in year 5/6

Children do **not** fast on days that they have curriculum PE (unless of course they are obliged to fast due to passing puberty)

Children only fast on set days of the week, so Miss Lee can still order school dinners, knowing who is fasting when.

Mrs Gow will collect a register of fasting children a week in advance and class teachers will be aware then of who is fasting, when.

Children only fast for one/two days maximum in a week (at least two of the other days will be PE days) to aid concentration.

Children will have access to a space without food/drink at lunchtimes and the prayer space to use throughout the time whilst food is being served

It is really important that the children make the decision to fast without peer pressure, as everyone's faith journey is unique and no one in our school should judge others (only God does this!)

Mrs Gow will fast with the children on set days throughout Ramadan and our Christian and Muslim children can join together for a hunger lunch/Lent lunch later in Ramadan and Lent to help us remember those who are less fortunate than we are.

A charity box for Blackburn Foodbank will be open in the school hall for donations of food/toiletries etc to be collected on a weekly basis.

Children from Year 4 may choose to join Mrs Gow and others for a day's fasting in school later in Ramadan.




